Ice Miller Client Schrödinger Enters into License and Collaboration Agreement with Novartis

Ice Miller client Schrödinger, Inc. (NASDAQ: SDGR) today announced a research collaboration and license agreement with Novartis to advance multiple development candidates into Novartis's portfolio for further development. The companies also announced an expanded three-year software agreement that substantially increases Novartis's access to Schrödinger's computational predictive modeling technology and enterprise informatics platform.

As part of the agreement, Schrödinger will receive \$150 million upfront payment, with eligibility to receive up to approximately \$2.3 billion in milestone payments plus royalties on each product commercialized by Novartis.
